- 1776-1779 Currency: Thirty, Fifty-Five, and Sixty-Five dollar *Continental Currency* notes, issued by "The United Colonies" at Philadelphia in 1776 and 1779. (Catalog# 87.1-3)
- 1800 November 17 Pay Allotment: Pre-printed allotment form for United States Navy sailors to designate some of their pay to family. This form was completed by Jesse Cole. The form reads "I Jesse Cole seaman on board the United States vessel of war Constitution commanded by Silas Talbot Esqr. do by these present allot eight dollars fifty cents per month of my wages for the support of my family. And I do hereby appoint Tabitha my wife my Attorney to receive for that purpose from the Navy Agent at the port of Boston the said sum of eight dollars fifty cents monthly for the term of ten months; the first payment to commence on the first day of February 1801. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 17th day of November 1800 - Jesse Cole." The allotment was also signed by Silas Talbot and James Dublois (Purser). There is also writing on the reverse, including Tabitha's mark. (Catalog# 2087.1)

- 1808 November 14 Card: Engraved anatomical diagram presented to Benjamin P. Kissam on November 14, 1808. Marked: "New York Novr. 14, 1808 ANATOMY No. 19." On reverse: "Dolls 25." (Catalog# 356.1)
- 1814 September 10 Currency: Printed bank note: "The President and Directors of the Manufacturers' Exchange Company promise to pay ..." made out to O.H. Perry, for ten dollars. (Catalog# 1387.1)
- 1814 October 24 Order for stationary and quills for the commander of USS CONSTITUTION, signed by Charles Stewart and approved by William Bainbridge, Boston October 24, 1814. (Catalog# 2002.1)
- 1815 March 21 Invitation: requesting Capt. Loring to attend dinner in honor of Isaac Hull. (Catalog# 1129.1)
- [1815] Invitation: printed ticket: "Naval Dinner. Admit [Capt. Loring], To the Public Dinner to be given to Isaac Hull, Esq. Commander in Chief of the U.S. Naval Forces in the District, At Treadwell's Hotel, Wednesday, 3 o'clock." Signed: John F. Parrott, Joshua Haven, and A.W. Bell, Committee of Arrangements. - 1818 Calling Card: Printed in elaborate script: "Mrs. Isaac Hull." (Catalog# 155.1)

- 1820 November 20 List of materials requested by Amos Binney: 900 32 ounce sheet copper, 900 30 ounce sheet copper, 670 28 ounce sheet copper, 2240 pounds of 1 1/4 inch nails, 50 pounds of 3/4 inch nails.

Fitzgerald, Chairman, requests your attendance at the exercises in the Boston Navy Yard celebrating the return of 'Old Ironsides,' Sunday afternoon, the 13th of May, 1934, at three o'clock." - 1934 May 13 Program: General Public Reception, Sunday Afternoon, May 13, 1934 to the USS CONSTITUTION. Celebrating her return home. The program lists information about the parade through Boston and the events at the Navy Yard. The back cover lists the members of the welcome Home Committee and "Other Features of 'Welcome Home' to Old Ironsides" (Catalog# 1853.1)
- 1934 May 13 Program: Same as 1853.1 except someone has corrected the program. Details, which have been changed include times, music selections, speakers. This program also includes the estimated attendance at the exercises and the total number in the Navy Yard. (Catalog# 1853.2)
- 1934 May 13 Invitation to the Official State and City Welcome Home to the U.S. Frigate Constitution, May 13, 1934. Signed by John F. Fitzgerald, chairman of the Welcome Home Committee. Invitation reads: "The U.S.S. Constitution Welcome Home Committee, Honorable John F. Fitzgerald, Chairman requests your attendance at the exercises in the Boston Navy Yard celebrating the return of "Old Ironsides," Sunday afternoon, the 13th of May, 1934, at three o'clock." Lower left corner reads, "For admission present this invitation at Water Street Gate to Navy Yard." (Catalog# 2011.1)
