- 1835 Magazine: *American Magazine*, vol. 1, 1835. Article entitled: "United States Frigate Constitution," gives brief history of ship as she is about finished being restored in 1834. Mentions wood from restoration used for souvenirs. 4 pages (83-88) taken from larger volume. (Catalog# 1889.1)
- 1839 April Magazine: *The United States Magazine and Democratic Review*. Contains an article on page 421 entitled "Old Ironsides on a lee shore." (Catalog# 1409.1)
- 1843 Booklets: *Life of Andrew Jackson, private, military, and civil. With Illustrations. By Amos Kendall*. A serialized biography of Andrew Jackson. These are the first five parts of fifteen. (Catalog# 1476.2a-e)
- 1846 April 4 Magazine: *Littell's Living Age*. Contains a letter from the *Journal des Debates* concerning CONSTITUTION in Cochin China and the abduction of the French bishop Lefevre. (Catalog# 1464.1)
- 1855 March 3 Magazine, *Ballou's Pictorial*. Brief description of battle with HMS GUERRIERE. States that USS CONSTITUTION'S 24 pound guns actually fired less than 22 pound shot. Short explanation of cannon science; states size of crew. Five pages (129-144); page 137 contains an engraving by Wade titled: "Constitution & Guerriere." (Catalog# 1813.1) Oversize
- [1855] Magazine: *Ballou's Pictorial Drawing Room Companion*. Part of an article on USS CONSTITUTION'S battle with HMS GUERRIERE. (Catalog# 1845.1) Oversize
- 1875 February Magazine: *The National* The February 1875 edition of this magazine, including, on pages 29-32, the article: "Luck of the old 'Constitution' Frigate" by Admiral L.M. Powell. (Catalog# 1544.1)
- 1875 July 10 Magazine: *Harper's Weekly, A Journal of Civilization*. Article entitled, "Old Ironsides," 19 pages (553-572). Describes possible destruction of USS CONSTITUTION. Calls for protection of ship, includes Oliver Wendell Holmes' poem, and a brief history of USS CONSTITUTION from 1794-1875. Includes etching of Andrew Jackson figurehead and USS CONSTITUTION in drydock. (Catalog# 1823.1) Oversize

- 1885 July Magazine: *St. Nicholas: An Illustrated Magazine for Young Folks*. The July 1885 edition of this magazine, containing, on page 678, the article: "A school afloat" about Navy school ships, by John H. Gibbons and Charles Barnard. (Catalog# 728.2)
- 1886 June 5 Magazine: *Harper's Weekly A Journal of Civilization*. Portrait of Oliver Wendell Holmes on front cover. Short article about Holmes on page 355. (Catalog# 1393.1) Oversize
- 1894 August 25 Magazine: *Harper's Weekly*. Article "The First Frigate Action of the War of 1812" by James Barnes with painting, "The 'Constitution' and the 'Guerriere'" by Carlton T. Chapman. Short history of War of 1812 up to detailed description of GUERRIERE battle. 24 pages (793-816) (Catalog# 1813.2) Oversize
- 1894 December 29 Magazine: *Harper's Weekly*. Article by James Barnes detailing battle and aftermath with HMS JAVA (12/1812) with painting, "The 'Constitution' and the 'Java'" by Carlton T. Chapman. Describes JAVA as carrying copper, dispatches, and "valuable articles." Follows briefly LT Aylwin's last days and USS CONSTITUTION'S return to the United States. 24 pages, (Catalog# 1813.3) Oversize
- 1895 February Magazine: *St. Nicholas for Young Folks*. The February 1895 edition of this magazine, containing the article: "The last voyage of the 'Constitution'" by S.G.W. Benjamin. (Catalog# 1464.2)
- 1896 March 7 Magazine: *The Illustrated American*  
Article: "The Good Ship 'Constitution.'" Discusses history of USS CONSTITUTION through battle with HMS GUERRIERE. Includes poem by Joseph Smith entitled, "The Constitution and The Guerriere." Includes black and white etching of USS CONSTITUTION in battle with HMS GUERRIERE. Pages 299-302 (Catalog# 1830.11)
- 1896 July 25 Magazine: *Harper's Weekly*. Article by James Barnes, "The 'Constitution,' The 'Cyane', and The 'Levant'" with illustration by Carlton T. Chapman. Article begins in 1812 and follows Charles Stewart's USS CONSTITUTION'S career. Describes battle and aftermath with CYANE and LEVANT. Reports that USS CONSTITUTION had been returned to rest in Massachusetts a "few years" before 1896. 4 pages (721- 744). (Catalog# 1813.4) Oversize

- 1896 October 31 Magazine: *Harper's Weekly*. Article by James Barnes, "Chase of the 'Constitution'" with illustration "'Hull Hoisted out his boats ahead, and they began the weary work of towing'" by Carlton T. Chapman. Describes the Great Chase of July 1812 and the crew's return to the United States 24 pages (1065-1088). (Catalog# 1813.5) Oversize

- 1897 November Article: "Old Ironsides." In: *The New England Magazine*. An article by Edmund J. Carpenter, concerning CONSTITUTION'S first one hundred years, cut from the November 1897 of the magazine. (Catalog# 1735.1)
- 1898 May 26 Magazine: *Life Vacation Book Number, Volume XXXI*, Number 807, New York, May 26, 1898. Article: "Our Flag Afloat. Yard-arm History of the United States Navy," by Midshipman Marlinspike. Story about the relationship between Captain Isaac Hull and Captain Dacres of HMS GUERRIERE. Pages 440-443. (Catalog# 2040.1)
