- 1812 "Hull's Victory: The Constitution and Guerriere." Unknown poet. (Catalog# 977.1) Location: CS/VIID2
- 1814 "Huzza for the Constitution" Unknown poet. Six-stanza poem commemorating USS *Constitution's* spring 1814 cruise. (Catalog# 1022.1) Location: CS/VIID2
- 1851 April 9 Last stanza of "Old Ironsides" by Oliver Wendell Holmes. Hand-written. (Catalog# 170.1d)
- 1913 July "The Constitution and the Guerriere: a Ballard of 1812." Published in Everybody's Magazine. July 1913, xxix, pages 43-48. To the tune of "The Landlady of France." Includes illustrations. (Catalog# 1900.1)
- 1931 October 31 "The Jump of Life." By G. B. Morris. Five stanzas concerning USS *Constitution* while in Port Mahon during Barbary War, 1803-1804. (Catalog# 381.1)
- 1932 March 12 "Old Ironsides" by Adeline Lincoln-Garretson. The poem commemorates USS *Constitution's* departure from Beaumont, TX, 1932. (Catalog# 485.1) Oversized.
- 1934 "Old Ironsides in Retrospect" by Private 1<sup>st</sup> class Charles Dow while serving on board USS *Constitution* during the National Cruise, 1931-1934. (Catalog# 1929.1)
- 1957 "Peace" by Captain Edgar C. Hilliard. Four-stanza poem on peace. There is a hand-written inscription relating poet's command of USS *Constitution* in 1945, as a Boatswain's Mate 2nd Class. (Catalog# 572.1) Oversized
- 1961 "Old Ironsides" copy of poem written by Oliver Wendell Holmes in 1931. (Catalog# 568.1)
- 1966 "Of Tall Ships and Sailing Men A-Hull" by Captain Edgar C. Hilliard. (Catalog# 572.2) Oversized
