- 1801 November 6 Payroll receipt. Records workers names, times of service, receipts of pay, workers signatures for carpentry work on USS CONSTITUTION; certified by N. Morris and Isaac Hull. Total payroll for 1 week period (\$695.07). [Catalog# 343.1] Oversized
- 1801 November 20 Payroll receipt for carpenters employed on board the Frigate CONSTITUTION, Lt. Isaac Hull, Commander, from Saturday, the 14th of November to Friday, the 20th day of November 1801. Four sheets of paper glued together vertically. Names of carpenters in left column, days worked in the next columns, total amount earned in numbers, total amount received written in full, signature or mark in the most right column. Total of \$735.84 was paid out. Signed by "Morris" and "Isaac Hull."

- 1801 December 4 Carpenters' payroll. Records 98 workers' names, times of service, receipts of pay, workers' signatures for carpentry work on USS *Constitution*; certified by N. Morris and I. Hull. Total payroll for two-week period was \$1,328.63.

- 1802 June 4 Carpenter's payroll. Records 117 workers' names, time worked, pay receipts, workers' signatures; certified by N. Morris and S. Nicholson.

- 1803 July 27 Receipt: Ship's bread. The receipt was for two shipments of ship's bread, both on July 27, 1803 from Samuel Thwing. The bill was for \$430.44. The receipt was also signed by James Deblois the purser and Samuel Brown, Boston's Navy Agent.

- 1829 August 11      "Statement of Repairs made upon the Frigate Constitution in 1820 and 1821." The document lists all the repairs completed and mentions the "propelling machine." Possibly written by Charles Morris.

- 1845 June 6         Addressed to "Mr. James Wooldridge, Treasurer Corps of Philadelphia Grays", it reads: "Sir: Please pay the amount due me (\$13) for services during riot of July 1844, to Joshua Jones, or order. J. Chauncey Brown (signed)."
